Lewy Body Dementia (LBD) is not a rare disease. It affects an estimated 1.4 million individuals and their families in the US. Because LBD symptoms can closely resemble the commonly known diseases like Alzheimer's and Parkinson's disease, it is currently widely underdiagnosed. Many doctors or other medical professionals are not familiar with LBD.

Pamela is the manager of Family services for the Lewy Body Association, the only national organization devoted solely to Lewy Body disease. She has masters degrees in Applied Gerontology and Clinical Counseling Psychology from Brenau University and is a Licensed Associate Professional Counselor in the state of Georgia.
